Our approach

JHCPB will strive to maximise value for the Project, it's stakeholders, and the communities we operate within through sustainable procurement practices. JHCPB acknowledges that sustainable procurement enables long term financial resilience while minimising impacts on the community and environment.

Social Procurement Policy in practice

JHCPB will and expects all our employees, contractors and business partners to:

- Uphold ethical practices, comply with the Modern Slavery Act (2018), and consider human rights and labour practices in alignment with ISO 20400: Sustainable Procurement Guidance
- Source sustainably and ethically, whilst preferencing:
 - Local suppliers around or close to the Project site or within Inner West Council and City of Sydney Local Government Areas
 - Regional suppliers within Greater Western Sydney and NSW
 - Australian suppliers
 - Aboriginal suppliers
- Ensure all procurement decisions consider environmental, social and economic aspects through non-cost multi-criteria analysis including:
 - Safety
 - Quality
 - · Environment and Sustainability
 - Local and Aboriginal Participation
 - Past Performance and Reputation
- Require suppliers and subcontractors, within their own supply chains, to:
 - Maximise local content and Aboriginal participation
 - · Actively analyse, identify and manage Modern Slavery risks
 - Investigate opportunities to reduce resource consumption (including the feasibility of renewables), minimise waste or divert from landfill, and reduce the embodied carbon of high materiality construction materials such as concrete, steel and asphalt
- Explore opportunities to stimulate innovation through procurement to enhance whole-of-life environmental, social and economic outcomes for the communities we work in
- Reward and promote exemplary performance and innovation within the supply chain
