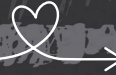

# Rozelle Interchange Project puts safety first with Emergency Response Training

The Rozelle Interchange project's Safety team have implemented extensive measures to ensure all personnel are well prepared for the unlikely event of an emergency. A key element to the Safety Team's long term program includes regular Emergency Response Training (ERT) for all on-site personnel.

ERT is an element of the ongoing safety coaching that all site workers must attend. The training enhances skills and knowledge to better recognise emergencies. The training also teaches how best to report emergencies in the case of an injury, helping them understand the most appropriate actions in various emergency situations.

The tunnelling team recently sat their first training for the year at Tunnel Site A.

The training focused on preparing, reporting and responding to emergency warnings and advice. Participants also learned how to choose the most appropriate course of action for various scenarios and how to evacuate from a dangerous area.

Training and Development Manager Rebecca Britt said Emergency Response Training is an important tool to reinforce safety behaviors.

"I think the more prepared people are for emergencies, the better they are at following evacuation plans," she said.

"It also means that they'll be somewhat more confident operating emergency equipment and making decisions that protect themselves and their colleagues."

JHCPB staff residing in the Gordon Street Site Offices also recently attended the Emergency Response training at the Rozelle Rail Yards.

Once completing the course, participants receive a nationally accredited Statement of Attainment - a certification that can be used on the Rozelle Interchange and all future projects.
